The future of Compton – Your Neighbourhood Development Plan update May 2019

At the end of April members of the Compton Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) were given an interesting tour around the Compton Pirbright site, gaining a useful insight into the scale of the site, the amount of green space as opposed to the developed areas, and the state of repair of the buildings. The tour brought back many good memories for some of the group – both former employees as well as those who were frequent visitors to the on-site social club, The Pickled Pig.

It is an extensive site with much green space and includes buildings that were built as far back as the 1940s to more recent 1990-builds.

With the longer spring evenings, the NDP working groups are busy using the time to focus and investigate on specific areas of interest such as housing, businesses and jobs, environment and community.

We are including updates from the different groups in every issue of *Compilations*, this month Alan Garmonsway's reports on the work and the survey that the Community, Education and Facilities (CEF) Working Group has been undertaking.


"Our working group is considering how the NDP can assist us in growing our community in the village.

"As a starting point the group has been talking to people associated with a wide range of up to 30 different 'organisations' – from schools to church groups, scouts and guides to football. It has given some useful information on all sorts of different topics, such as suitability of physical facilities, communication across the village and the potential for new activities.

'We shall be further analysing this and gaining more information with a view to showing preliminary thoughts and findings at the village fete in early July.

"Residents will have a chance to feedback thoughts and opinions so that we can build up a consensus picture of how to develop a vibrant hub to serve the needs of the village in the future.
